Ruth Lister is Professor of Social Policy at the University of Loughborough, and the celebrated author of *Citizenship: Feminist Perspectives*, and *Poverty*, and many other classic texts on feminism, citizenship and poverty. Alongside her academic work she has served on the Commission on Social Justice, set up by the late John Smith, to advise the Labour Party; the Fabian Commission on Life Chances and Child Poverty; and the National Equality Panel, established by the Minister for Women and Equality, Harriet Harman.

Angela O'Hagan is a Research Fellow at the Caledonian Business School. She is a member of the Scotland Committee of the Equality and Human Rights Commission. Angela is also Convener of the Scottish Women's Budget Group, and a member of the Scottish Government's Equality Proofing Budget Policy and Advisory Group. Angela also served on the original ministerial Scottish Social Inclusion Network from 1999-2002.

Dr. Marsha Scott is a feminist activist, researcher and practitioner and has advocated, volunteered and worked in the field of violence against women for 20 years. She is the Convener of the Board of Directors of Engender and represents [Engender](#) (and Scotland) on the UK Joint Committee on Women. She is a member of the Scottish Parliament Cross-Party Group on Men's Violence Against Women and Children and sits on the Women's National Commission's Violence Against Women subgroup.
